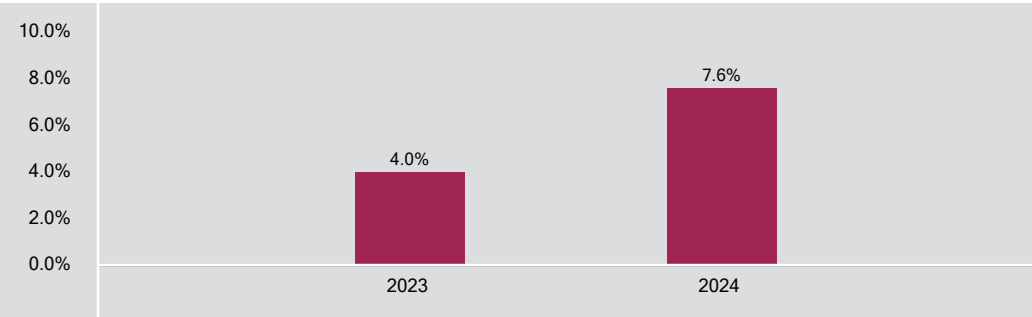

1. SALES CHARGES

Your representative is able to charge you up to 5.00% of the amount you buy (up to \$50 on every \$1,000 you buy). You and your representative decide on the rate. This amount is then deducted from the amount you buy and it goes to your representative’s firm as a commission.

2. FUND EXPENSES

You don’t pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund’s returns. The fund will pay to the Manager a performance fee in relation to Class A units that is equal to 15% of the amount by which the total return of the Class A units exceeds a 3% hurdle rate, for the period since the performance fee was last paid, subject to accumulation in years where no performance fee is paid, provided that the total return of the Class A units for such period exceeds the previous high-water mark, exclusive of taxes. The performance fee is calculated as described in the Simplified Prospectus on a daily basis and paid annually. As of December 31, 2024, the expenses of Class A were 3.34% of the value of this class. This equals \$33.40 for every \$1,000 invested. Performance fees were 0.79% of the expenses, this equals \$7.90 for every \$1,000 invested.

More about the trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the fund. It is for the services and advice that your representative and your representative’s firm provide to you. Pender pays the trailing commission to your representative’s firm. It is paid from the fund’s management fee and is based on the value of your investment. The trailing commission is equal to 1.00% of the value of your investment each year. This equals \$10.00 each year for every \$1,000 invested.

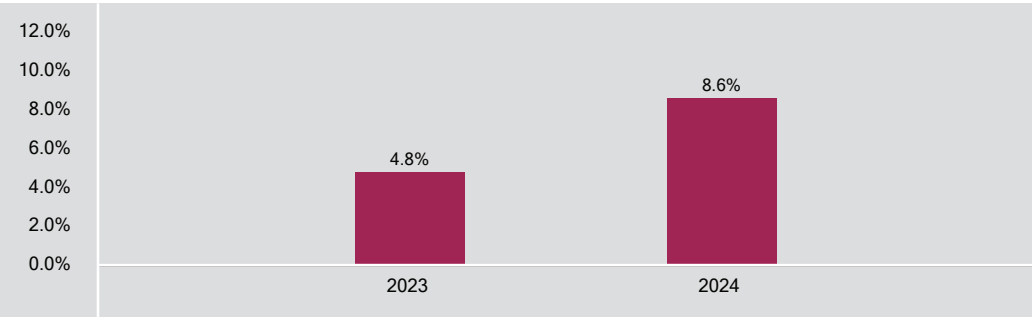

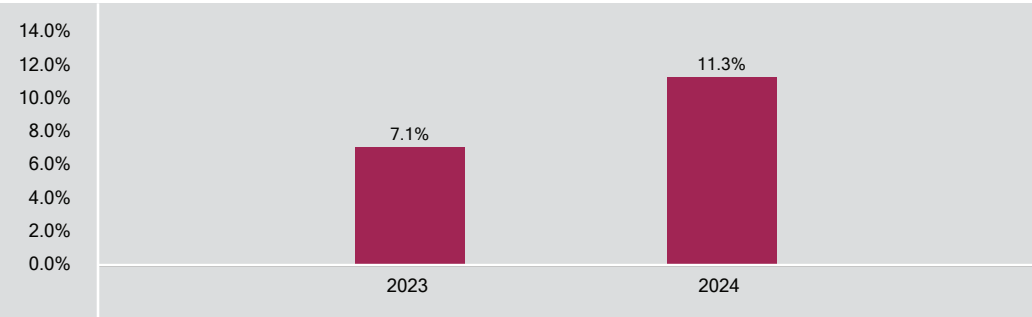

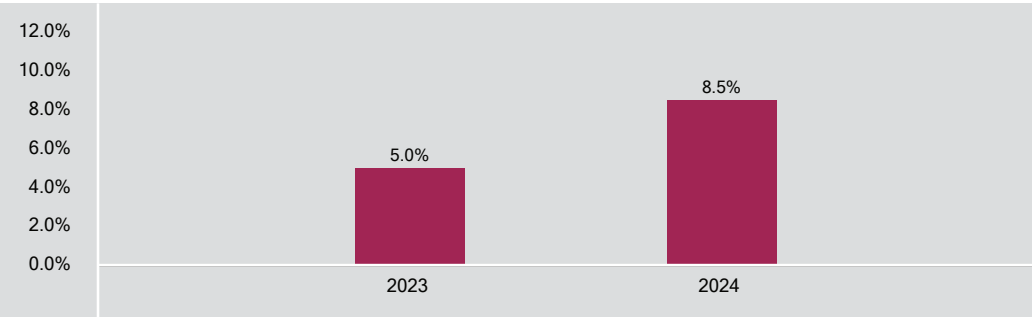

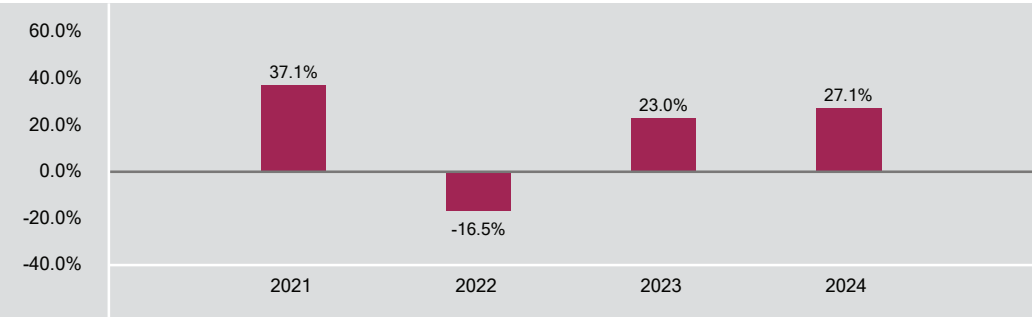

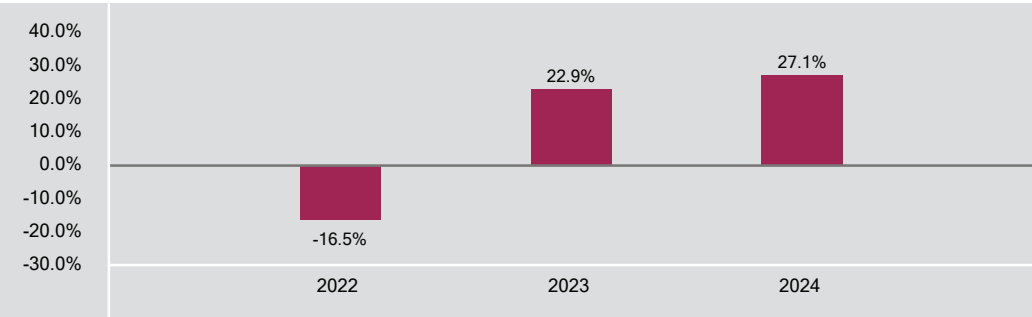

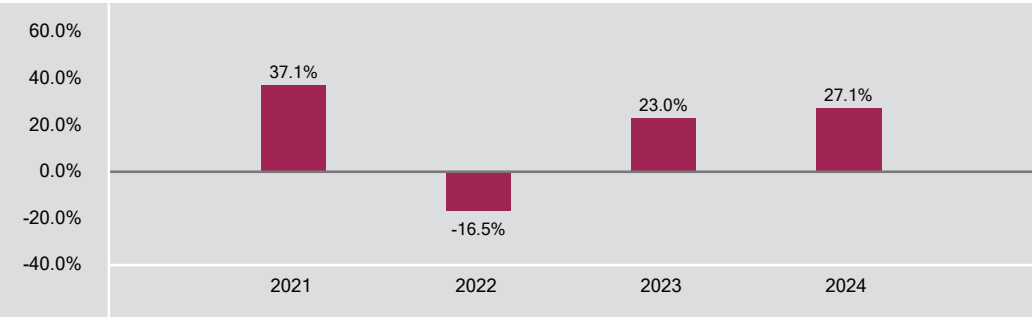

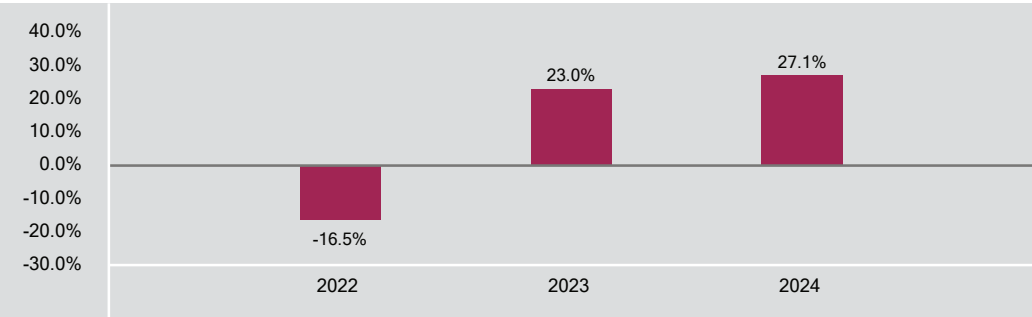

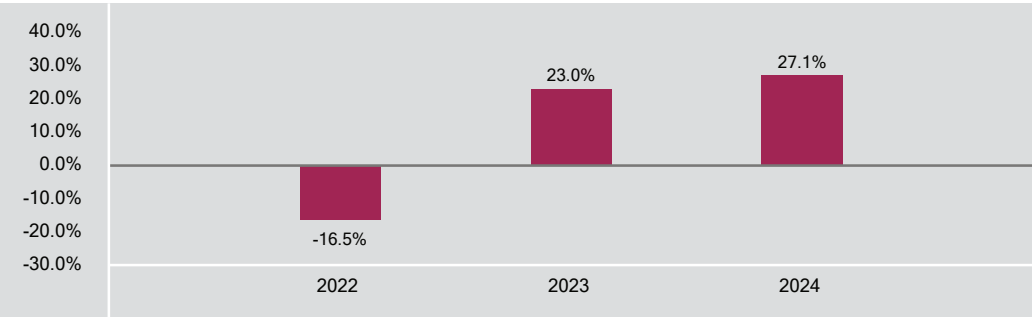

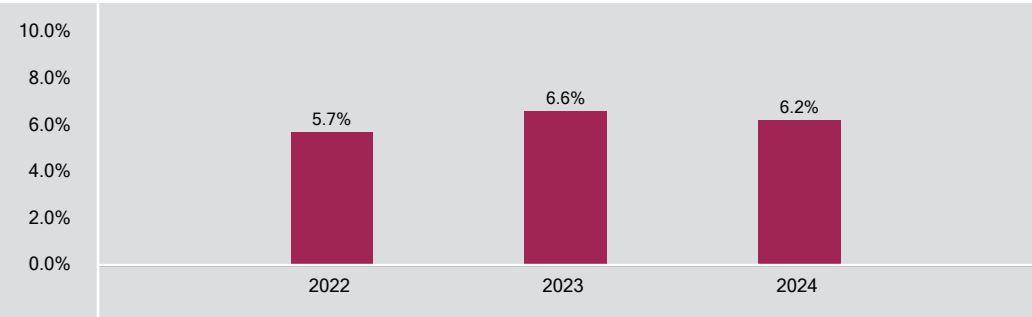

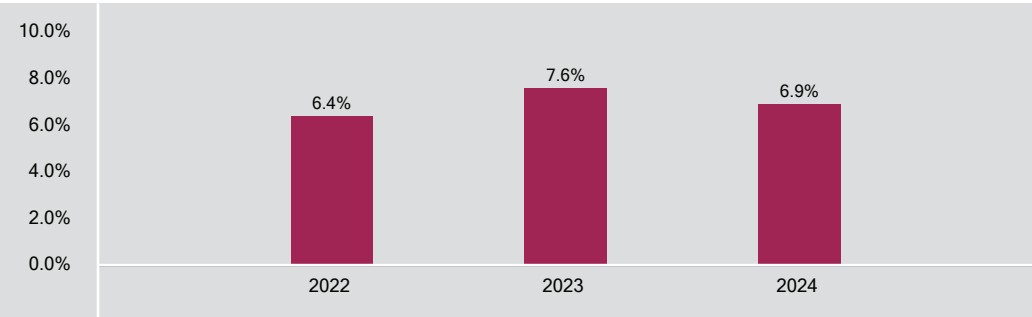

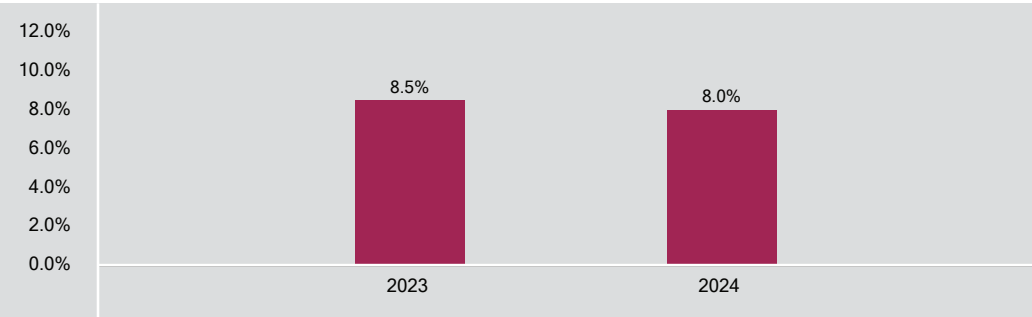

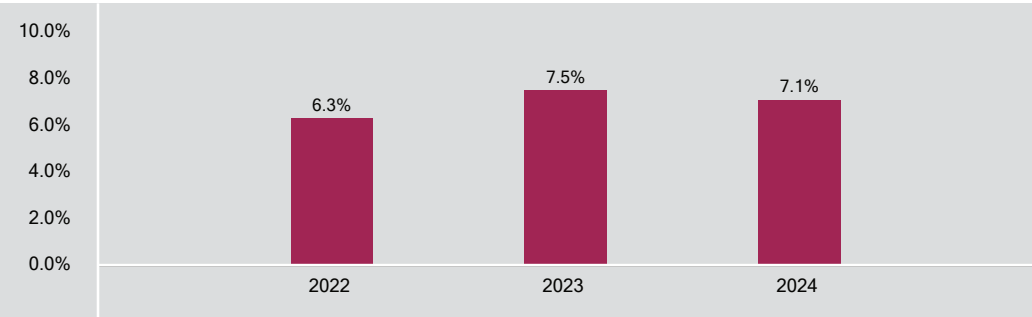

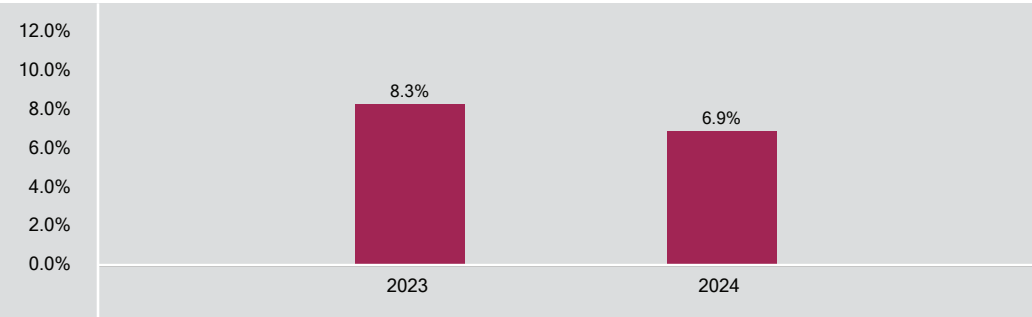

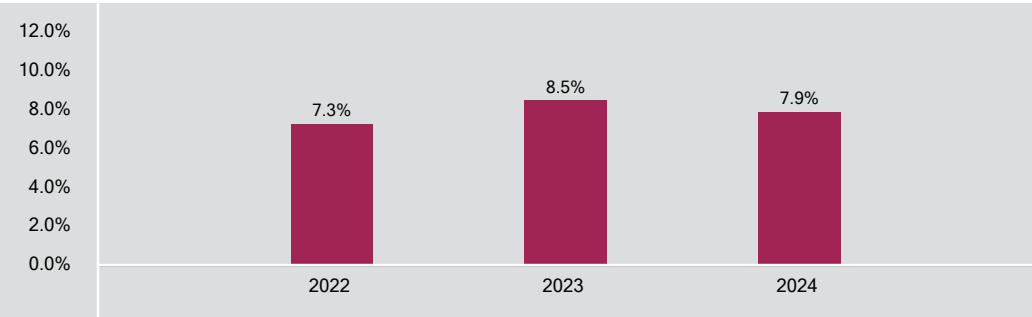

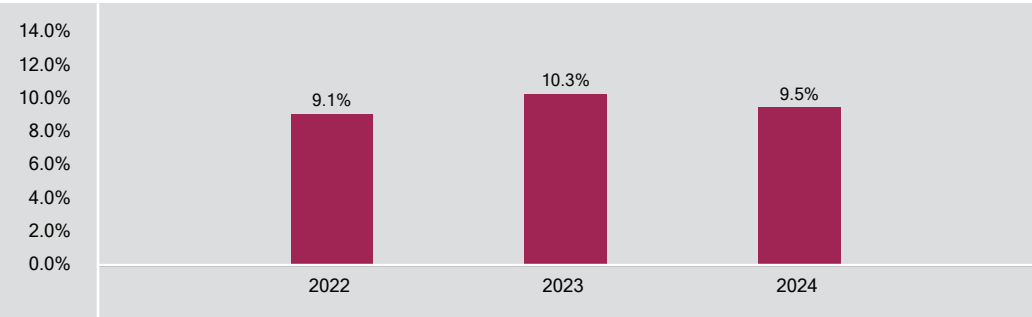

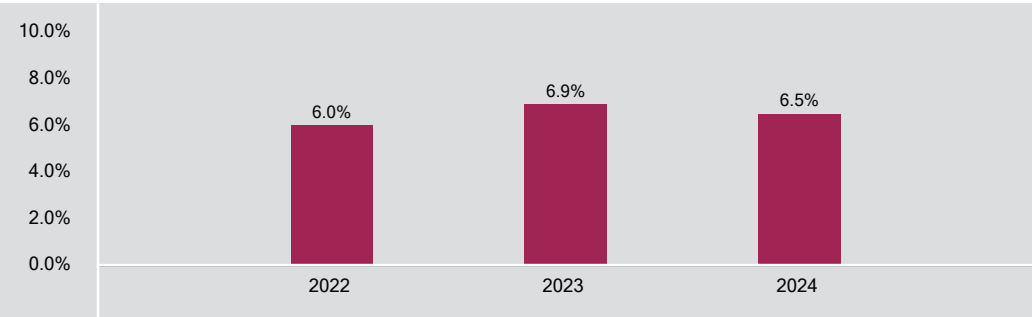

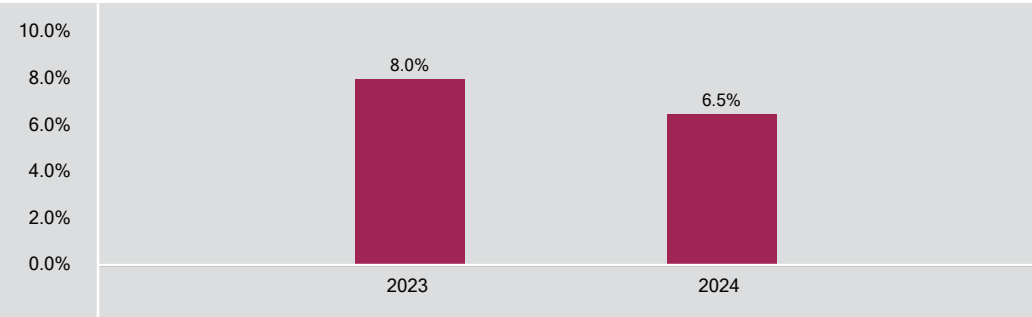

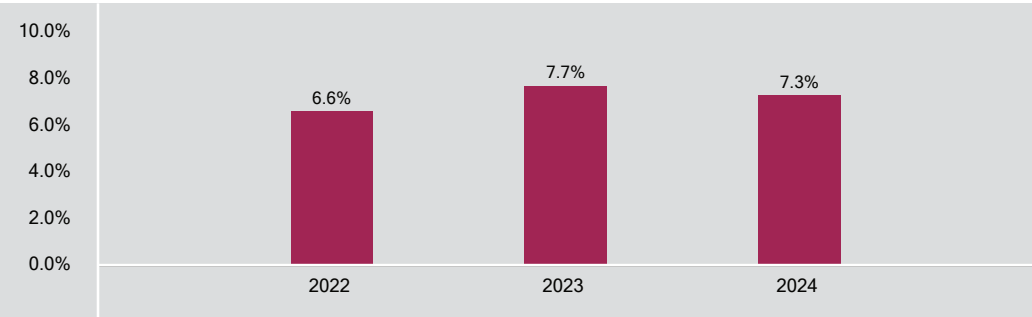

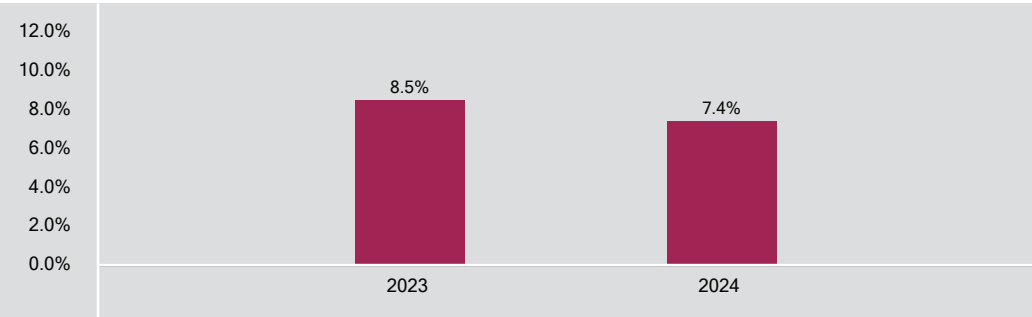

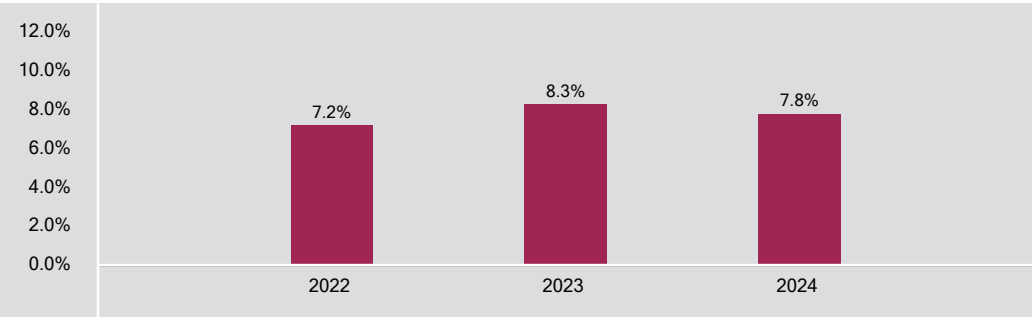

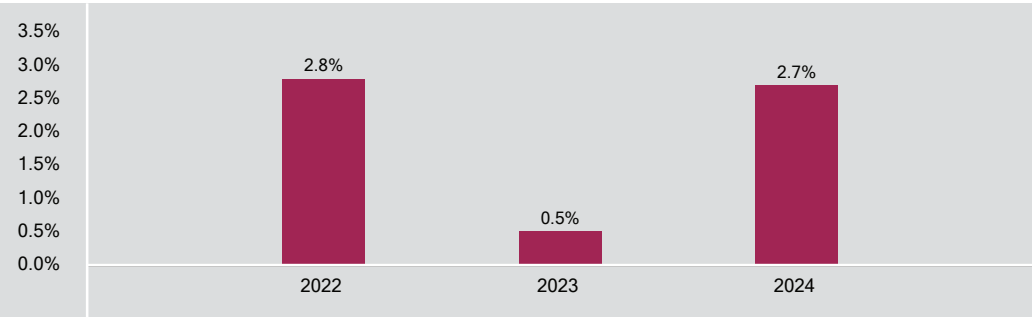

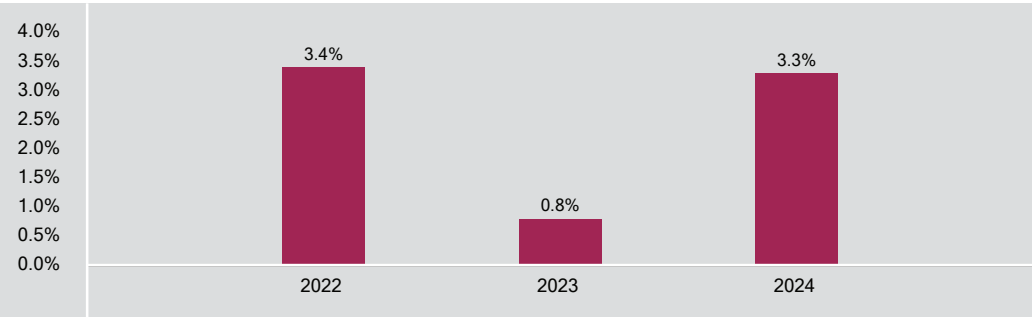

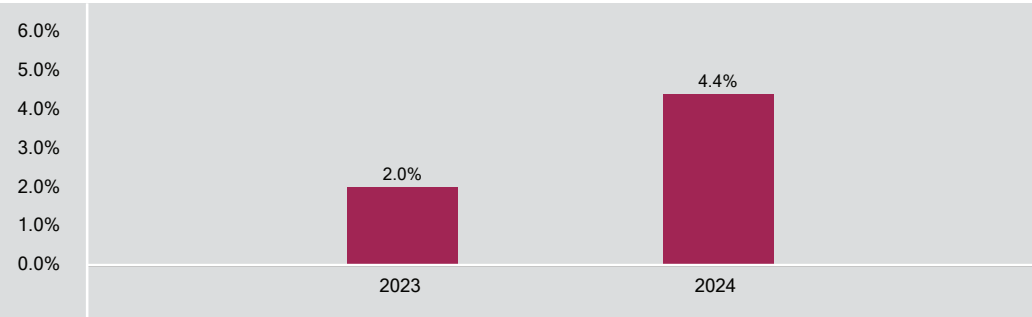

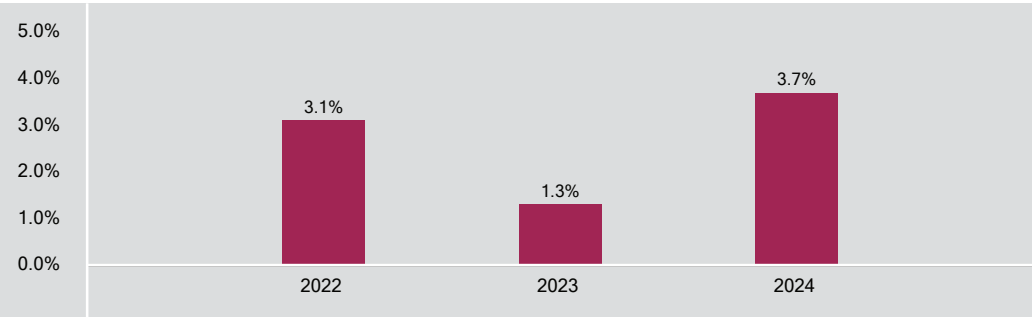

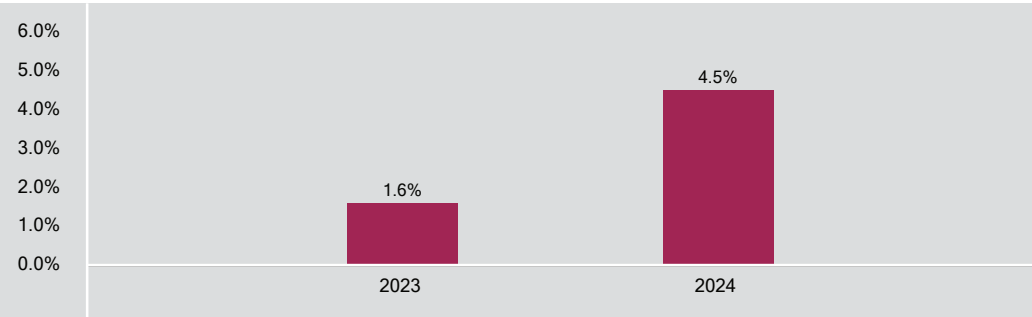

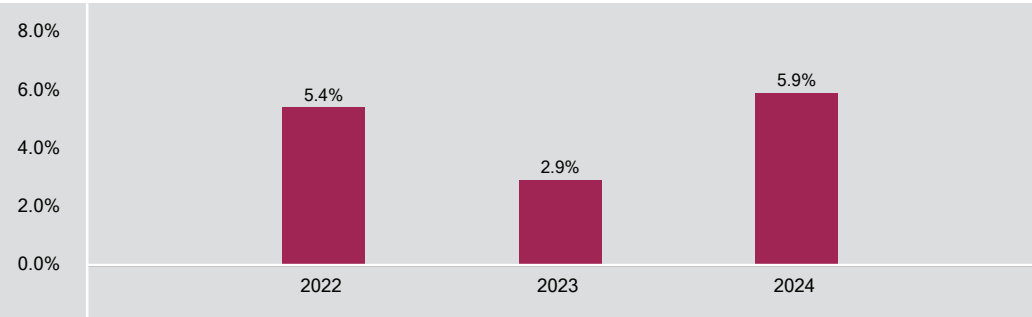

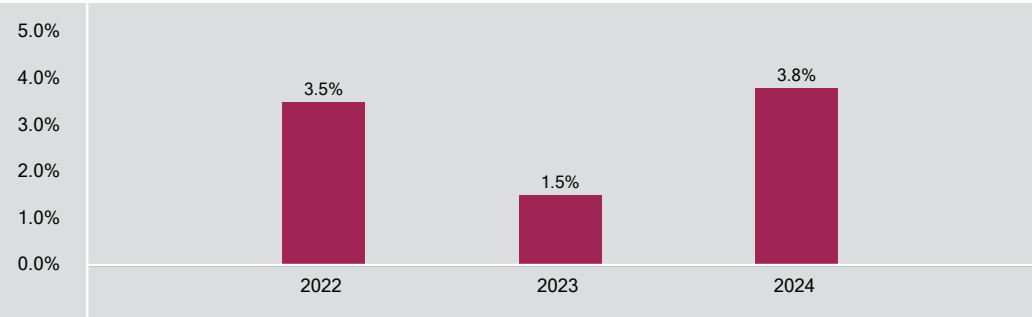

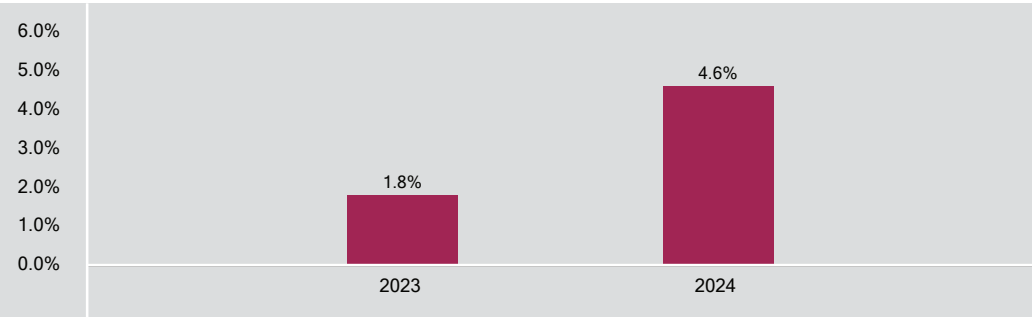

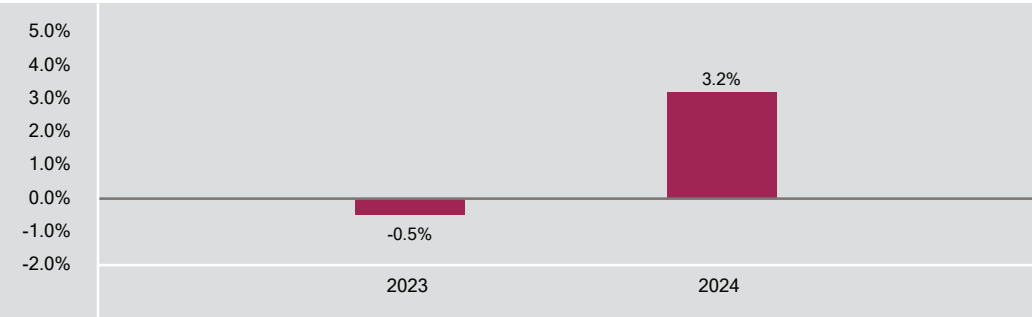

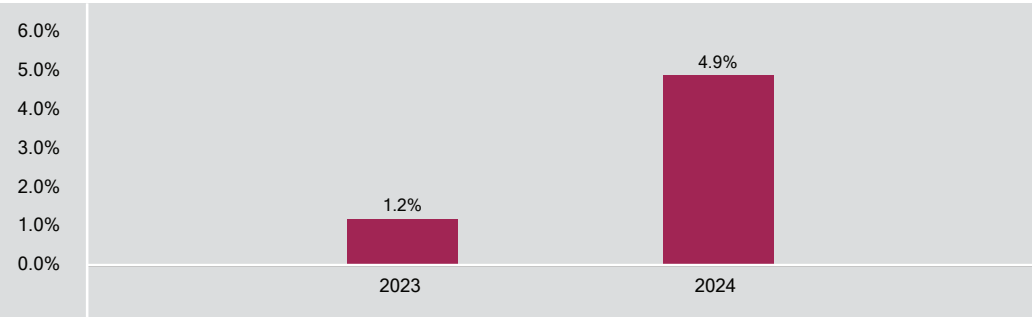

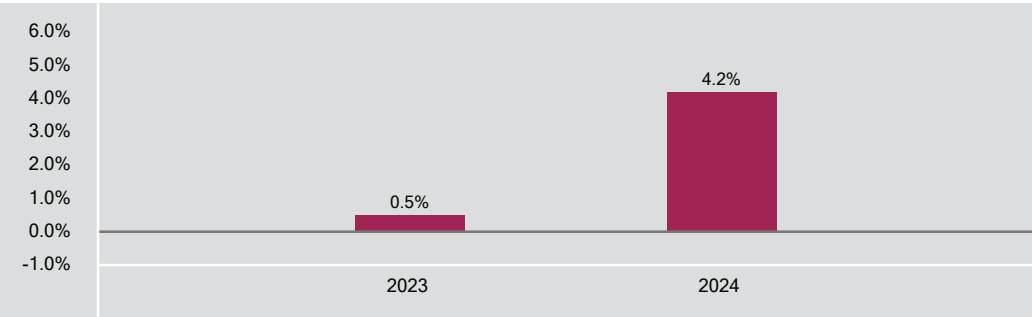

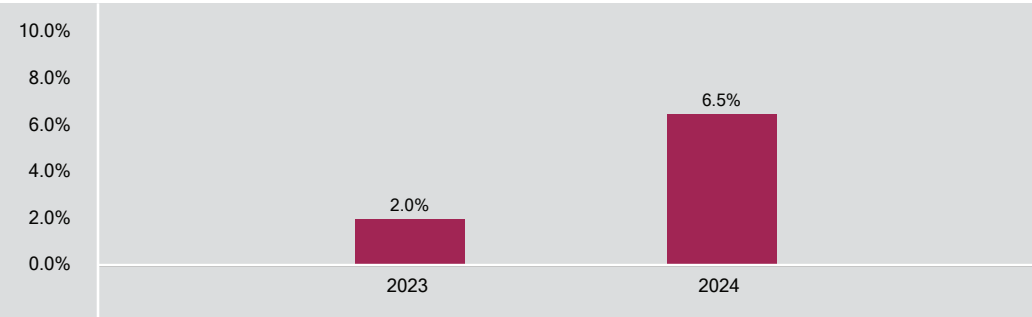

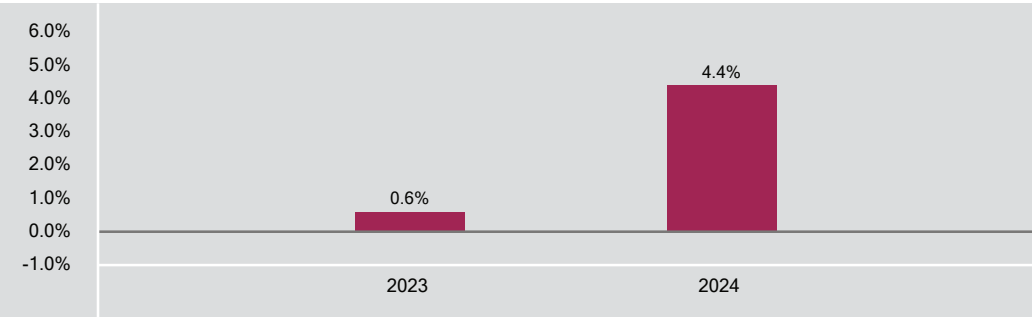
